The course contains eight (8) instructional modules delivered in a facilitative/didactic format.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Professional Practice Project Management Contract Administration Cost Management Safety & Risk Management Quality Management Value Engineering Time Management. <p>The CM Standards of Practice Course (CMSOPC) is designed for the advanced CM including professionals preparing for the CCM examination administered by the Construction Management Certification Institute (CMCI). Instructional materials and instructors are provided by CMAA. Certificates and credit transcripts are provided to each course participant.</p> <p>To be eligible for the CCM is based on Applicants must have 48 months responsible in charge (RIC) experience as a CM/PM, Plus one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 4-year Degree (Construction Management, Architecture, Engineering, or Construction Science) 2-year Degree & 4 yrs. Experience in General Design/Construction 8 Years Experience in General Design/Construction <p>***This experience is in addition to the 48- months CM requirements***</p> <p>Applicants interested in applying for the CCM exam may do so at the CMCI site.
