REQUIREMENTS

The Facility Management Professional (FMP) credential is offered by the International Facility Management Association (IFMA). There are no specific educational or experiential prerequisites for the FMP program or final assessments. Below are some of the benefits to receiving the FMP credential:

TEST FORMAT

The FMP credential is comprised of four foundational course modules:

- Finance and Business - Learn the essential finance and business practices and how to integrate those into your function as a facility manager. Understand how to engage finance, legal, procurement, risk managers, and others to maximize decisions for your organization.
- Operations and Maintenance - Learn how to assess and inspect facility needs. Manage, oversee, and monitor O&M of buildings, systems, and equipment. Understand the processes for developing occupant service specifications and more.
- Leadership and Strategy - Effective strategies require facility managers to be able to integrate people, place, and process. They must be able to align the facility portfolio and functionality with its organization's missions and available resources.
- Project Management - Plan, initiate, and execute projects. Understand the entire project life cycle and how to monitor and control project performance. Learn about the facility manager's role in projects and how to evaluate outcomes.
