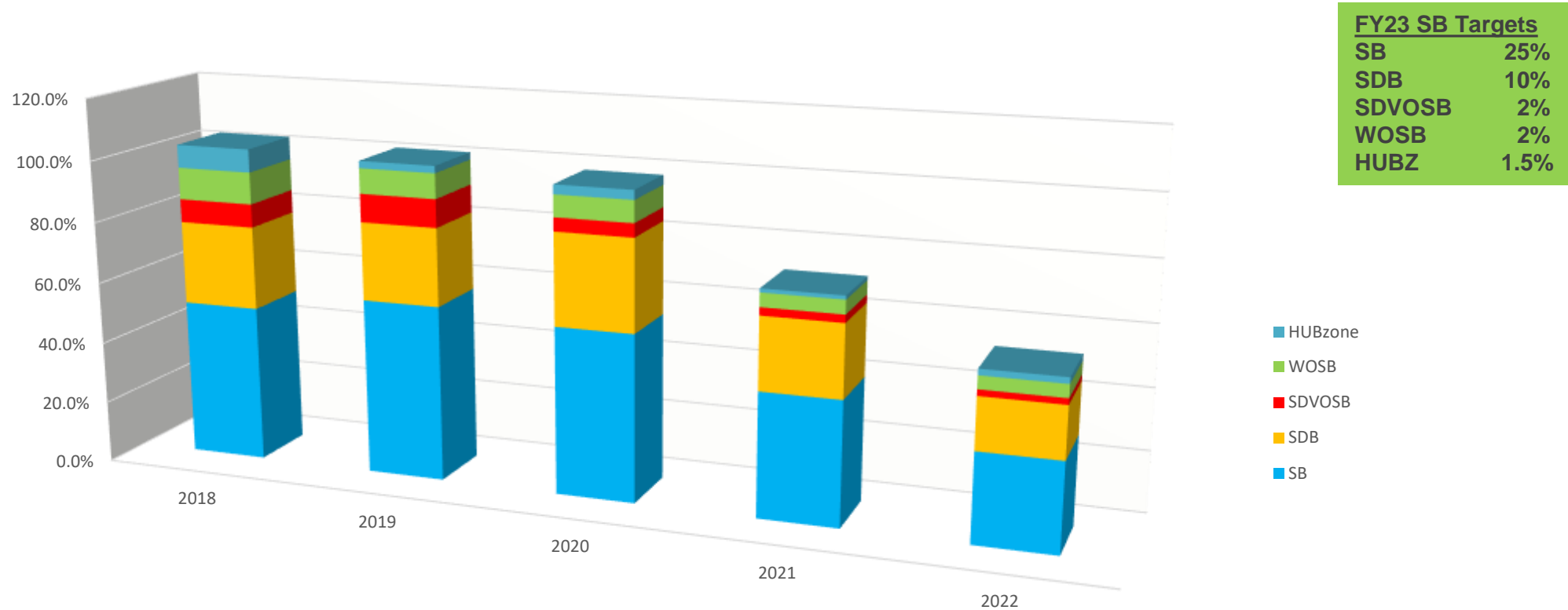

# MILITARY CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM DEFINITIONS



## Military Construction

- Any construction, development, conversion, or extension of any kind carried out with respect to a military installation (10 US Code 2801)
- Potentially funded with a variety of funds types (MILCON, O&M, RDT&E)

## MILCON

- Specific type of authorization; projects are line item appropriated by Congress
- \$9M and higher
- 5-year money

## Unspecified Minor MILCON

- Smaller MILCON projects are not line item appropriated; each component manages their own program
- \$9M threshold
- 5-year money

## Energy Resilience and Conservation Investment Program (ERCIP)

- Subset of MILCON intended to fund projects that improve energy resilience, contribute to mission assurance, save energy, and reduce DoD's energy costs
- 5-year money

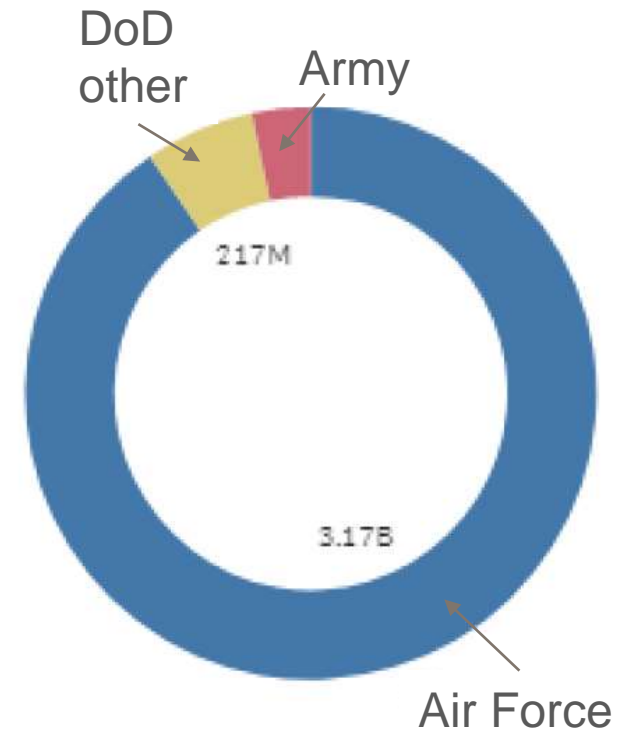
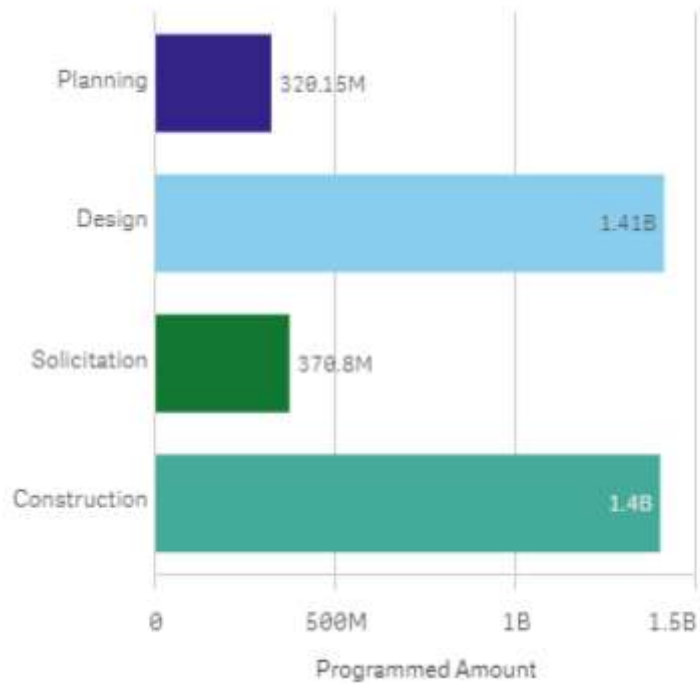

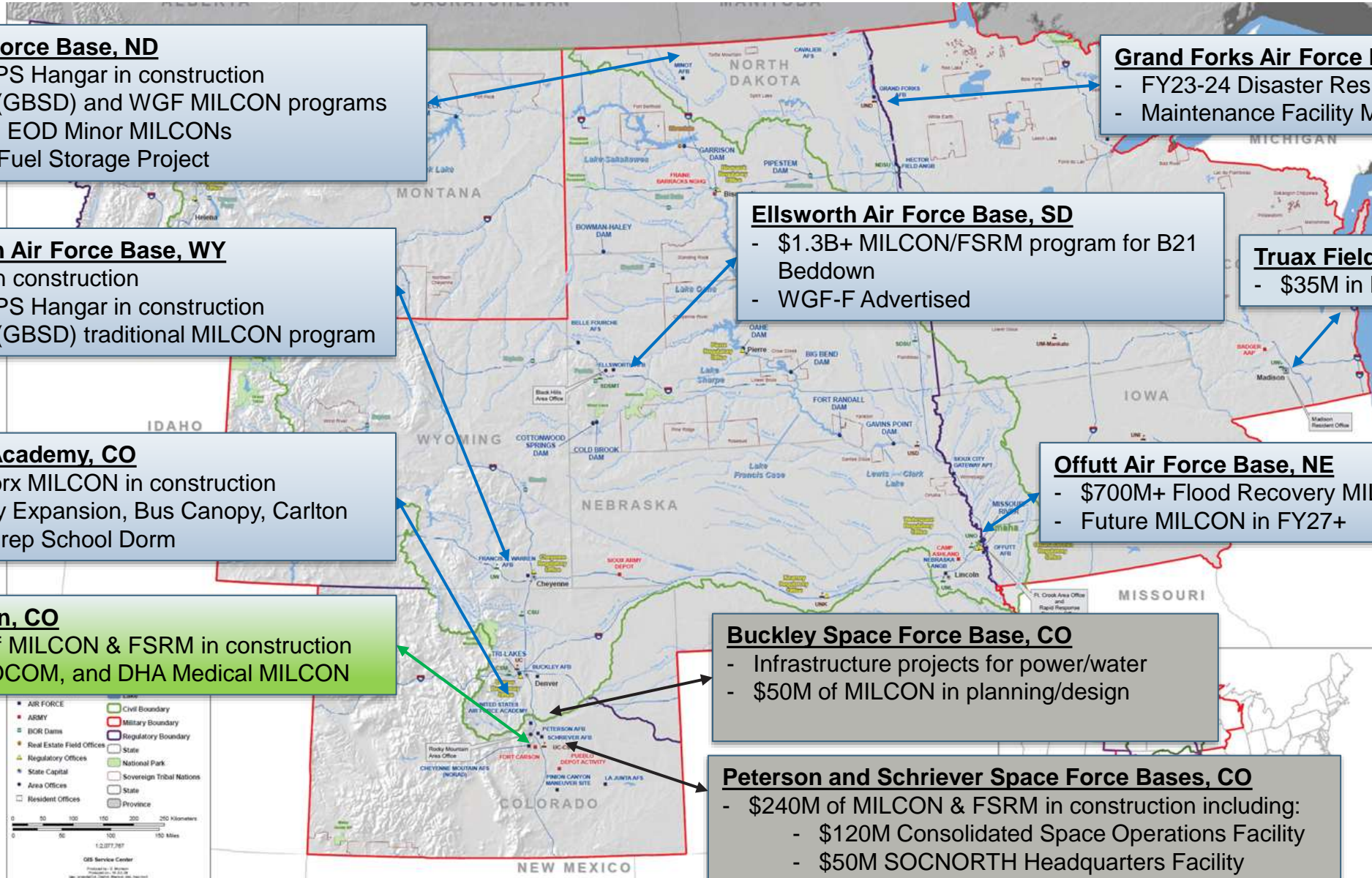
