




Why a Memorial Honoring Nebraska's Vietnam War Veterans?

- \$5.6 million project
- Approximately two acres
- Located south of 108th Street and Highway 370, three miles from the Omaha National Cemetery
- Papillion La Vista South High School and SumTur Amphitheater are neighbors
- 50-year lease signed with the City of Papillion during Summer 2020
- One million (1M) pounds of American granite (26 truckloads) will be used


