### Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) and Puget Sound Engineering and Science Scholarship Fund (PSE&SSF)

  - Public in-state institution Approx. \$27,000/year
  - Public out-of-state institution Approx. \$45,000/year
  - Private institution Approx. \$56,000/year

    - 100 GET Units ~ 1 year Tuition; there has been a 35% decrease in credit price from 2015 High

## SAME – PSE&SSF

Puget Sound Engineering and Science Scholarship Fund (PSE&SSF) - incorporated November 23, 1999 as a non-profit, IRS designated 501(c)(3) organization

### Founded with the support of the Seattle SAME Post to:

- Protect the Scholarship fund in the event of legal action against the Post
- Ensure a focused and professional investment strategy for scholarship funds
- Ensure long term continuity of scholarship awards and growth of fund corpus
- Broaden and focus fund raising opportunities

## SAME – PSE&SSF

- PSE&SSF Board of Directors composed of active and retired engineers or scientists
  - The majority of which are members or former members of the SAME Seattle Post
- Point of contact between the PSE&SSF and the Post is the Post Scholarship Committee Chair
  - Who is also a member of the PSE&SSF Board
- Creation of PSE&SSF as a separate legal entity has an additional benefit:
  - Providing an organization to which individuals and companies who have not historically supported SAME can contribute to further the objective of encouraging students to study science and engineering






## SAME FUND – *Restricted* (continued)


- Fund investments managed by professional financial advisor (UBS)
- Forecasted Fund earnings based on 5-year cycle: present cycle is 2021 – 2025; calculated allocation of \$12,000/year starting with the 2022 scholarship campaign
- Forecasted earnings plus additional annual Post contribution dictate amount available for yearly scholarships


## Post Annual Funding



## **Fund History**





- In an effort to increase the number of scholarship awards, PSE&SSF is communicating with Seattle Post sustaining member firms and individual members to encourage them to sponsor an individual scholarship.
- PSE&SSF has already contacted Post sustaining member firms and emailed all Post individual members.
- For a donation of \$1,500 or more, scholarships can be named in honor of a company or person and restricted to a particular discipline and/or school.
- PSE&SSF manages the scholarship process (i.e., advertise scholarship, collect applications, review applications, select scholarship award winner).
- Award winners would be recognized in the Post Scholarship Presentation at Meet-the-Chiefs

## **PSE&SSF** Timetable

## Recommendations 2022

- \$32,000+ available in 2022 (Estimate based on 2021)
  - \$20,000 available from the SAME Seattle Post; would like to see this allocation remain stable or increase
  - \$12,000 available from PSE&SSF
- Scholarship money is divided evenly between High School Scholarships and Post Member-sponsored Scholarships
- 2022 recommended numbers and amounts (based on 2021)
  - 14 High School scholarships (2 awards at \$2,000 each & 12 awards at \$1,000 each)
  - 2 Post Member-sponsored scholarship awards at \$3,000 each
  - 4 Post Member-sponsored scholarship awards at \$2,500 each
