

REGION 9 INFRASTRUCTURE MANAGEMENT TEAM (ENGINEERING)

- USFWS Re-Organized in 2020
 - Engineering was consolidated and moved internally under the National Refuge System
 - Purpose:
 - Restructure the facilities and engineering programs in an effort to increase efficiencies and improve delivery of engineering and infrastructure services.
 - Design an organization that fully integrates the Engineering the NWRS and FAC facilities management structures to eliminate duplicative capacities across regions to improve accountability, customer service, and streamline engineering product delivery.
- West Coast IMT (12 Engineers and Architects):
 - Planning, design and construction for fish hatcheries and wildlife refuges.
 - Manage A/E and construction management contracts
 - Fish passage engineering
 - Technical engineering support

THE GREAT AMERICAN OUTDOORS ACT

- Allocate \$900 million each year to the Land and Water Conservation Fund while also providing up to \$9.5 billion over five years to begin clearing up a mounting maintenance backlog within the DOI.
- This bill establishes the National Parks and Public Land Legacy Restoration Fund to support deferred maintenance projects on federal lands.
- For FY2021-FY2025, there shall be deposited into the fund an amount equal to 50% of all federal revenues from the development of oil, gas, coal, or alternative or renewable energy on federal lands and waters. Deposited amounts must not exceed \$1.9 billion for any fiscal year.
- The fund must be used for priority deferred maintenance projects in specified systems that are administered by:
 - National Park Service
 - Forest Service
 - U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service
 - Bureau of Land Management
 - Bureau of Indian Education
