# The National Guard

- 1636 First muster of the Massachusetts's Militia 387+ yrs ago
- Up through the 19th Century, State Militias made up the bulk of the military forces in the US.
- 1853 Organic Act. President Fillmore creates the Washington Territories, Maj Isaac Stevens appointed first Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territorial Militia
- 1903 Militia Act. Created the National Guard of the US
- 1916 National Defense Act. Gave the President the power to "Federalize" the NG in times of emergency
- 2008 National Defense Act. Changed NGB to Joint Function of DOD, with the Chief NGB going from 3 to 4 star billet

# WA Army Guard Construction Program

  - Covers all state facilities, office on Camp Murray
  - Adam Iwaszuk
- Headquarters: Army Guard Installations Office
  - NGB-G9, office in Washington D.C.
  - COL Anthony Hammett
- Contracting:
  - State Contracting through Department of Enterprise Services
  - Federal Contracting through USPFO Contracting Office

# WA Army Guard Program Size and Outlook

- \$20.5 mil in SRM Funding
  - 35% allocated for Modernization & Restoration
  - 65% allocated for Sustainment through MCA
- Readiness Centers are 50% Federal / 50% State funded
  - Historically Limited State funding = limits work on facilities
- Future Years Defense Plan (FYDP)
  - 2022 Snohomish Armory Modernization to RC \$10M
  - 2024 Yakima Training Center Dining Facility \$ 6M
  - 2025 Joint Force Headquarters Facility \$57M
  - 2028 Tumwater Field Maintenance Shop \$35M

### Washington Army National Guard Real Property

#### 1. Current Real Property Inventory

- 213 Buildings Statewide
- 31 Readiness Centers (also occupy 4 AFRCs as Tenants)
- 30 Sites Statewide (not including 10 Storefront Recruiting Offices)
- Total of 2,366,852 square feet

#### 2. Real Property Maintenance Support Status - Fed/State Share

- 5 Readiness Centers 75% Federal Reimbursement
- 26 Readiness Centers 50% Federal Reimbursement
- After 25 years, Readiness Centers Become State Owned Facilities

#### 3. Real Property Maintenance Backlog

- \$171M to achieve Quality Rating Level 1 for Readiness Centers
- \$69.5M to achieve Quality Rating Level 2 for Readiness Centers

### Current Capital Budget Projects - FY 23-25 Biennium

#### 1. Anacortes Armory Addition/Alteration Convert to Readiness Center

- Tenant Improvement for 15K sqft of existing facility and adding 4K sqft new addition.
- Modernizing restrooms and supply area, adding classrooms and fitness room, upgrading utilities (HVAC & electrical) and achieving seismic code requirements.
- Funding: \$8.6M total (\$4.9M Federal & \$3.7M State).
- Estimated project completion August 2024

#### 2. Snohomish Armory Addition/Alteration Convert to Readiness Center

- Tenant Improvement for 13K sqft of existing facility and adding 5.5K sqft new addition.
- Modernizing restrooms, administrative offices, break area, vault space and supply area. Adding classrooms and fitness room, upgrading utilities (HVAC & electrical) and achieving seismic code requirements.
- Funding: \$9.8M total (\$6.5M Federal & \$3.3M State).
- Estimated project completion Summer/Fall 2025


#### Washington Army National Guard Military Construction (MILCON)

- Information Operations Readiness Center (\$35M FY 2013) 100% Federal Funding, Located on JBLM. Completed in 2015.
- Pierce County Readiness Center (\$26M FY 2010/2011) Federal (75%) and State (25%) Funded Located on Camp Murray. Completed in 2017.
- Yakima Training Center Barracks (\$21M FY 2016) 100% Federal Funding, Located on Yakima Training Center. Completed in 2022.
- Thurston County Readiness Center (\$34.19M FY 2017) Federal (75%) and State (25%) Funded Completed in 2022. Received LEED Gold Certification in 2023.
- Richland Readiness Center (\$15.2M FY 2020) Federal (75%) and State (25%) Funded Completed in 2022. Received LEED Gold Certification in 2023.
- Joint Force Headquarters Phase I (\$57.7M FY 2025) Federal (75%) and State (25%) Funded. To be located on Camp Murray as Design-Build construction project.




