



## **VA Construction Program**

- Construction and Facilities Management
  - Major Construction Projects with a cost greater than \$20 Million require a line item appropriation by Congress and require a specific authorizing legislation. Projects are moving more toward **Design-Build** in the future.
  - Leasing-Projects to acquire space for medical care and services to Veterans.
  - Seismic Program Seismic deficient facilities to be replaced or renovated for "similar function/original purpose".
  - NDFE Currently partnering with USACE Projects over \$100 million
- Medical Centers, National Cemeteries
  - Minor Construction -Consists of projects \$20 million and less
  - Non-Reoccurring Maintenance (NRM) -Projects to correct facility deficiencies and renovate existing space
- Office of Asset and Enterprise Management
  - Green Management Program Alternative fuels
  - Enhanced Use Lease (EUL) –Alternative uses for facilities







## **Construction & Facilities Management**

- 1. Planning, design, and construction for VA Major construction including National Cemetery projects
- 2. Responsible for acquisition and administration of procurements:
  - Support services Construction Management, Lease Acquisition Support Services,
  - Supporting VHA, NCA, and VBA
  - Major construction \$20M to \$100M
  - Architect Engineer (AE),
  - FY21 \$1.2B spend
  - Responsible for Major Construction Interagency Agreements
    - \$7B program VA's agreement with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Assists with construction procurements for other Administrations (Minor and Non-reoccurring Maintenance projects - under \$20M)
- Promotes competition for small businesses (including Veterans First Program) in major construction, design, and support services:
  - Over 70% of contract dollars awarded to SDVOSB/VOSBs in FY21
  - Including Several Major Construction Projects





## **VA Integrated Service Networks (VISN)**



## **VHA FY22 Minor Construction Forecast**


