Jan 2022 InfraCenters - Unlocking Integrated District-scale Infrastructure

Clark Brockman, AIA, LEED Fellow, Principal SERA Architects, Inc.

Biography:

Clark is one of SERA's Principals focused on sustainability, and a champion for climate-responsive design in the built environment. Co-founder of SERA's Sustainability Resources Group (SuRG), Clark is an experienced speaker, facilitator and passionate advocate who has helped lead the firm's continuing evolution in the arenas of high-performance buildings and district scale infrastructure, while also working outside the firm on multiple sustainability initiatives and policy efforts designed to transform the market.



He is a LEED Fellow, past Chair of the Cascadia Green Building Council, a past founding board member of the International Living Future Institute, where he now serves on the Advisory Board. He keynotes nationally and internationally on the impact of the built environment on climate change, and serves as a green building policy advisor to cities, counties, regional governments, states, national organizations and the federal government. He is a member of advocacy committees for AIA COTE National and the ZERO Coalition, and spoke at the 2014 SAME Sustainability Summit in Seattle. Clark is a US GSA Professional Peer and served as a juror for the 2012 AIA COTE Top 10 national sustainable design awards.

Abstract: InfraCenters - Unlocking Integrated District-scale Infrastructure

Currently, individual buildings receive the lion-share of attention when it comes to aspirational performance in the built environment. Owners, developers, and government clients are seeking buildings with "Net-zero" performance and enhanced resilience for energy, water, waste and carbon. Yet, as it turns out, buildings are usually the wrong scale to optimize performance. Jumping to the district scale, where multiple buildings are inter-connected as nodes on a larger system, greater synergies can be leveraged and performance optimization can be increased. With "Infrastructure" as the topic of the moment, and the Federal Government providing significant investments in this arena, now is the time to expand the deployment of district infrastructure systems to capture the added value from performance optimization and to bolster the future resilience of our neighborhoods. The presentation will explore current trends and opportunities in this space.

Biography:

George Seaman is Project Manager at the Port of Portland for the \$1.65B Portland International Airport's Terminal Core Redevelopment project. Over the past fifteen years, George has been project manager on a number of highly visible and complex Port projects including the Deicing System Enhancement, Replace Access Control System, and Exit Lane Implementation projects. George is a graduate of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and his career has spanned the country. He previously worked for Davy McKee Corporation in Cleveland Ohio designing petrochemical facilities, and as facilities engineer and project manager in the semiconductor industry building fabs in East Fishkill, New York for IBM, then in Colorado Springs for Symbios Logic and LSI Logic. George moved to Oregon with LSI Logic in 2002 and joined the Port of Portland in 2005.
