

Background

- The Acquisition Support Team (AST) was established in April 2015 and is tasked with enhanced acquisition and overall management of contract instruments essential for the District mission execution. The team is primarily responsible for the development and award of IDIQs which are high dollar, complex, or mission critical. Upon award, the contracts are transferred to Contracting.
- The AST is also responsible for receiving, vetting, and coordinating IDIQ requests; advising branch PMs on development of new contract vehicles; establishment of innovative techniques to expedite acquisitions; maintaining the EDW database; annual coordination for SAME Industry Day; support of CT, as necessary.
- The team is cross-matrixed
- The AST awarded \$1.36B in contract capacity in 2021.




