



Mission Support Business Model




Coast Guard Org Chart






Base Charleston: Current State




Base Charleston at a Glance

- Personnel (Base only)

Future of Base Charleston

- Cutter Homeporting (currently 4 cutters and 2 buoy tenders):
 - FY23: National Security Cutter CGC CALHOUN with ~130 personnel
 - FY26+: National Security Cutter CGC FRIEDMAN with ~130 personnel
 - FY30+: Charleston notional homeport for up to 5 Offshore Patrol Cutters with ~100 personnel each
- USCG Personnel in greater Charleston: 1,300 today; 2,300 by 2030.





USCG Base Charleston Planning

Land Exchange:

- In 2021 CG completed land exchange with SC Ports Authority. The final footprint for the N.
 Charleston CG campus will be 64 acres and three piers.
- Will utilize 2019 supplemental funds for a pier recapitalization project and new administrative building.




Finalized Land Exchange (Feb 2021)




FDCC Overview

Mission: We advance operations and support our people through shore facilities.

Vision: Expertly build and sustain the right facilities.

"Every Coast Guard Mission begins and ends at a Coast Guard Facility!"

- FDCC Organization
 - ~70 personnel between Norfolk & Seattle & Detached Duty (Charleston, PR, AK)
 - Planners, Engineers, Architects, Financial Support Staff work with Contracting Staff
 - 60 Active Projects in our Portfolio, \$2.7 Billion
 - Types of Funding: Major, MASI, Hurricane Supplemental, Housing, Infrastructure
- Project lifecycle: PP → PPR → RFP → Design → Construct



FDCC Project Execution Approach

- Predominantly Design-Build Approach
- Projects value typically range between \$5MIL to \$100MIL
- National Multiple Award Construction Contract (NMACC)
 - United States, Puerto Rico, and Territories
 - > Task Order Limits \$4M \$100M
 - Task Orders Not Posted on FEDBIZOPPS.GOV
- NMACC III
 - \$4B Aggregate Total
 - No task order limit
 - 3 pools (Large business, small business East Coast and West Coast)

- Pools 2 and 3 are Small Business geographically demarcated East/West. In Phase II of award process for SB Pools

NMACC III Scope of Work

- Primarily Design-Build (DB), but may include Design-Bid-Build (DBB), or performance-based construction
- General construction services includes new construction, marine construction, demolition, renovation, alteration, repair, restoration
- DHS enterprise-wide non-mandatory contract vehicle
- Three distinct contractor pools, as follows: One (1) Unrestricted Pool (Full and Open), and two (2) Small Business Pools (Reserves)

Procurement Approach

- Down Select Strategy & Process
- Best Value Trade Off
- Price Only for Low-Risk Projects
- Written Proposal, Oral Presentations







New Base Charleston Campus – Site Overview








Lessons Learned during Construction (so far...)

- Tradeoff decisions






