1. The Dec 5 Post Board meeting minutes are at https://www.same.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/01/241205sabod.pdf. Are there any changes needed?

Dick Kochanek briefed that he had made an error in *Attachment 3* of the Dec 5 minutes and did not include the \$1,000 for the College Student Chapter Support. He will correct the mistake and resend the minutes to Board members. There were no other changes to the minutes and the Board approved the Dec 5 meeting minutes with the change in *Attachment 3*.

2. Board Members:

- John Baker to install elected Officers/Directors not able to attend the 2024 Holiday Gala:
 - Cassandra Price (Secretary), Sam Hutchins (Treasurer), John Enyeart (Technical Solutions Director) and Harold Eberbach (STEM & College Outreach Director)

- Attachment 1 is the list of members interested in appointment/re-appointment to Board positions.
- Attachment 2 is the list of appointed Board positions not filled

John Baker installed Cassandra Price, Sam Hutchins and Harold Eberbach to the positions they were elected to. He later also installed John Enyeart to his position after he joined the meeting late. John Baker appointed/reappointed the members listed in Attachment 1 to the appointed Board positions shown with the exception of the Scholarship Director position. Diane Glass because of upcoming retirement is unable to fill the position so John appointed Moises Ramirez, who was recommended by Diane, as the new Scholarship Director. The Board reviewed the appointed positions in Attachment 2 that remained unfilled. Dick mentioned that John German was willing to continue as the TAMU Student Chapter Mentor, but needed to get reimbursement for travel and lodging since he was no longer able to drive back and forth from the meetings on the same day. Harold Eberbach and John Baker felt it was beneficial for John to continue as the Chapter Mentor and didn't have any objections to the reimbursement requested. Ed von Dran indicated that many Post volunteers were traveling to their events without travel being reimbursed, but understood about the need for lodging. After more discussion the Board approved reimbursing John for his lodging to attend three TAMU Chapter meetings. John German was therefore reappointed to the TAMU Student Chapter Mentor position. The Board discussed the other remaining appointed positions in Attachment 2. John Baker will discuss the UT Chapter Mentor positions with some retired military engineering officers working in UT Facility Management. John will review the need for the Military Enlisted Liaison and Social Media Coordinator positions as we move through the year. John Enyeart verified that I-WEPTAC, support for which was the primary workload for the Special Projects Coordinator, has moved in a different direction and agreed the position was probably no longer needed. Shelby Gund will look for interested LLAB participants for filling the LLAB Co-Director position.

3. Board Member Expectations:

• In previous years the Board has approved the policy that Board members are expected to attend at least three (3) of the scheduled Board meetings in the calendar year (typically 11 Board meetings are planned for the year). This may be waived by the Post President on a case-by-case basis.

The Board approved the Board member expectation of attending at least 3 Board meetings for 2025.

4. Finances/Budget:

- Attachment 3 is the 2024Budget Update (as of Dec 31).
- Attachment 4 is the 2024 Balance Sheet. This document shows the beginning balances of all accounts, income, expenses, transfers and ending balances of accounts on two pages.

- Attachment 5 is the 2025 Budget Update (as of Jan 25).
- Last year we started using QuickBooks Online as our accounting system.
 - o Sam Hutchins didn't realize that you had to Log Off versus Xing out which causes synchronizations issues in the backend.
 - On Jan 5 QuickBooks started acting up. Sam was told that there were a large number of synchronization errors in the back end and to fix the issue he was going to have to subscribe to data support.
 - o Sam chose the one-year support (\$1,199.99) versus the 30-day support at a couple \$100 less.
 - It took them a couple of hours to fix the issue. Lesson learned. They recommended monthly data reviews (included) which Sam will do. Based on the data reviews we can determine if we want to renew this next year.
- We need to conduct the annual financial audit. In the past we have used Board and long-time member volunteers
 for the audit. Sam and Dick Kochanek discussed the possibility of making this a LLAB and/or Post YPs annual
 project.

Sam Hutchins briefed that Attachment 4 was a more detailed breakout of the 2024 expenses and that Attachment 5 was the first update on the new budget and it is what members will get for future Board meetings. Sam briefed that he caused an unexpected expense for 2025 because of the way the new QuickBooks system operates and his use of multiple computers with the system. He was able with QuickBooks staff assistance to get our system back on line and learned a valuable lesson from the experience. Sam briefed the Post needs to conduct its annual financial review. Dick and Sam briefed their idea of having this requirement be an annual project for the LLAB and/or YPs to get them more involved in Post operations. Steve Holt volunteered to assist Selby Gund, LLAB Director, and Andrew Silvas, YP Director, in doing this year's audit as a trial of the idea.

5. Post Contract Execution Authority Renewal:

• Annually, the Board re-issues the authority for Chairpersons and POCs of major program/activities to sign contracts on behalf of the Board/Post when the activities and their related budgets have been approved by the Board IAW the Post Bylaws, Article V, paragraph 3 (see https://www.same.org/san-antonio/post-governance/).

The Board approved the authority for Chairpersons and POCs of major programs/activities to sign contracts on behalf of the Board/Post for 2025 IAW with the current Post Bylaws.

6. 2025 SBMRF:

- Scheduled for Apr 9-10 at Embassy Suites Landmark with Golf Tournament Apr 8 at the Quarry Golf Course...
- Sarah Fowlkes to provide updates at the meeting.

Cathy Bond-Cassidy briefed that 50 plus people had already signed up for the event. She said there was a meeting scheduled soon to finalize the AFCEC participation, but several other DOD agencies had already committed to participate. Dick mentioned that we had raffled off the large TV we were using for displaying the 1-on-1 sessions for participants to sign up for the sessions with the idea we would use a projector to display the schedule on the wall in the future. The existing Post projector is old and does not have a HDMI connector and the conversion cables Dick tried for VGA to HDMI signals do not work well with it. Dick also mentioned we might want to invite the SAME Executive Director and if so there is a SAME procedure for these type invites. Cathy said she would bring these issues up at the next committee meeting. John Baker indicated he knew Maj Gen Weir USA (Ret.) and could help with the invite. Sam Barnett also suggested SAME Vice President Ben Matthews might be invited since he was located close to San Antonio. John indicated if we were going to invite Ben it might also be correct to invite the SAME President Sharon Krock. Dick mentioned that the invite(s)

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might involve paying for their registration and rooms. John asked Sam what the financial impact was of inviting all three. Sam indicated there was \$3,000 in SAME/Local Conference Support or the cost could be taken directly from the SBMRF revenue. Cathy said she would take the invite recommendations to the committee for a decision. Dick suggested to Mike Beach that we also might consider providing the local CMAA Chapter with a complimentary foursome or a couple of slots for the Golf Tournament since the CMAA Chapter provided us with a free team registration at their Scholarship Clay Shooting Tournament. Mike will look into the idea.

7. 2024 Post Streamer:

- The Post Streamer submittal is due to SAME on Jan 31. The submittal is a required part of the Post Annual Report which is submitted by Mar 31.
- Attachment 6 is the Streamer Tracking spreadsheet for our accomplishments toward the 2025 SAME Strategic Plan Post Tasks in 2024.
 - o 1,700 points with 1 task completed in the IGE Goal is required to earn the Streamer; more than 1700 points earns the Streamer with distinction.
 - O You are allowed to repeat accomplishments for one (1) Post Task in each of the 5 Strategic Plan Goals
 - o Dick is estimating we earned 4,525 points for our accomplishments on the Post Tasks.
- Attachment 7 is the narratives for the Post Tasks. These are uploaded online for the Post Streamer submittal.
- For 2025 we will be operating under the 2030 Strategic Plan with its 3 new Goals.

Dick briefed that *Attachment 6* showed what we had accomplished in 2024 against the SAME 2025 Strategic Plan Post Tasks. Dick estimates we achieved 4,525 points against the 1,701 points needed to earn the Post Streamer with distinction for 2024. John Baker thanked the Board for their accomplishments. John asked whether we received the 2030 Strategic Plan Post Tasks yet. Dick indicated the 2030 Plan Post Tasks had not officially been published yet, but the draft of the Post Tasks that he was sent just condensed some of the Post Tasks from the 5 Goals of the 2025 Strategic Plan to align with the 3 new Goals of the 2030 Strategic Plan. Dick will follow-up with SAME to try to get an update on the new Post Tasks status. Dick provided a summary on how the Post Streamer system works and explained how important it is that we document an activity when we complete it so it can be used in the Post Streamer narratives. The Board approved submitting the 2024 Post Streamer.

8. SAME Awards:

- Dick is working 3 SAME Award nominations:
 - o Eric Wilbur new Leader Development Award
 - Joshua Graham Goethals Medal
 - o Sarah Fowlkes Post Service Medal
- Submittals are due on line by Feb 3

Dick reported that Eric Wilbur's nomination was finished and all that was needed was John Baker's approval to nominate Sarah Fowlkes for the Post Service Medal and John's endorsement for Joshua Graham's nomination for the Goethals Medal. John approved nominating Sarah and indicated he would get Joshua's endorsement letter to Dick.

9. Holiday Celebration:

- We budgeted \$6,500 and spent \$5,915 for the 2024 Holiday Celebration support.
- We should discuss if we are going to continue this level of support for future Holiday Celebrations.
- If so, we should start now on securing a venue.

Hilda Quinones briefed that it would probably take an extra \$2,000 to change locations for the Holiday Celebration from the Embassy Suites Landmark to another venue. She said the Embassy Suites people were easy to work with, parking was good, location was relatively central and the food was generally very good. Dick mentioned that event attendance seemed to be dropping and that we might need to consider a different concept for the event to increase participation. He felt that ticket cost was likely causing the lack of YP participation. Hilda said that the Dec 13 date for 2024 event caused conflicts that precluded regular attendees from participating and the drop in attendance. John Baker indicated that for future events we should try to avoid dates which other major organizations like the Greater Chamber of Commerce are having their Holiday parties on. Hilda briefed that if we are going to make a change in venues that we really need to do so by Mar 2025. John then asked that we do a survey of members to get their feedback and ideas on the Holiday Celebration and to try to include the link for the survey in the Feb newsletter.

10. Field/Student Chapters:

- We are hearing very little from our Field and Student Chapters except for the TAMU Student Chapter and a few events by the UTSA Chapter:
 - UT Austin Chapter we have lost the Post Mentor and last known Faculty Advisor; unsure whether we still have any student chapter members
 - o There has been no word recently from the Concho Valley and Laughlin AFB Chapters
 - Dick received a call last week from a member about the Coastal Bend Chapter. They sent Dick a list of
 interested members, but many of them were not SAME members or SAME members that were not
 affiliated with the San Antonio Post or Coastal Bend Field Chapter.
- Distance to most of these Chapters may be hindering our effectiveness in hosting them.

John Baker briefed he knew of some engineers in the UT Facility Management so he will contact them to see if they were interested in being the Mentor(s) of the UT Student Chapter. John asked about the UTSA Chapter and about some event(s) Terry Watkins mentioned in an email that were coming up. Dick said the Chapter was participating in the UTSA Welcome event and the Chapter had a meeting following it. John German briefed that the TAMU Student Chapter also had a very successful meeting on Jan 23. John German also said the Board's decision to provide lodging for his trips to TAMU would help, but that the travel reimbursement should continue to be reviewed because his replacement is likely to come from the San Antonio area, which is further away from the university then he has to travel. Dick mentioned the idea about having Mentor(s) for our Field Chapters so we have a better idea of what is going on at the Chapters. John Baker stated he would consider the suggestion.

11. Feb Newsletter – Inputs for the Feb issue are due Monday, Feb 3 to Dick.

12. Any Other Issues/Updates:

• Ed von Dran suggested the 2nd or 3rd Thursday in Mar at the Evil Olive for a New Members Meeting, which had been deferred from 2024. John Baker concurred with the dates. Ed said he was still looking at what

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new members should be invited and will provide suggested lists of new members from the last 6 and 12 months for review.

- Dick asked about whether we had worked out the details of supporting the SA Engineers Week Proclamation Breakfast on Feb 18. John Baker indicated he wanted to invite LLAB participants and YP members for our Post table and asked about whether the Post had materials for the Post exhibit table. Dick stated he had the table skirt, pull up displays and swag items for the exhibit, but felt we should focus on the SAME STEM Camps because high school students normally attended the event and the Camp application deadline was Mar 12. John Baker wanted to be sure that Post invitees for our table commit to attending so that it is full. Harold Eberbach mentioned that Scott Mikos had the lead for the event and would work out the details.
- John Baker mentioned he had some connections with SAISD Board members and would pass along to them information about the SAME STEM Camps and scholarships.

- Diane Glass to remind Moises Ramirez, new Scholarship Director, about his membership renewal.
- Board approved reimbursement of lodging for John German's participation at TAMU Student Chapter meetings.
- John Baker to reach out to UT Facility Management leaders and others on being UT Student Chapter Mentor(s).
- John Baker to review need for Military Enlisted Liaison and Social Media Coordinator positions.
- Shelby Gund to review LLAB participants for possible candidate for LLAB Co-Director.
- Steve Holt to work with Shelby Gund and Andrew Silvas for the annual financial audit.
- Board approved Board member expectation of attending at least 3 Board meetings for 2025.
- Board approved Authority for Chairpersons and POCs to sign contracts for the Board/Post after program approvals
- Invite and get commitments on attendance from LLAB and YP members to participate at Feb 18 E-Week Proclamation Breakfast Post Table.
- Board approved Dick Kochanek submitting 2024 Post Streamer.
- John Baker to finish Joshua Graham's SAME award nomination endorsement letter.
- Hilda Quinones and Dick Kochanek to develop member survey on Holiday Celebration participation.
- Board members to provide inputs for the Feb newsletter to Dick Kochanek on.
- John Baker to provide SAISD Foundation contacts information on SAME STEM Camps.

He explained about the use of the City's Project Dashboard technology to find the latest updates on and manage the City's Capital projects. There were 65 Post including government/military attendees at the meeting. 1.0 PDH was available for attendees.

At the Apr 18 Post meeting Col Rhett Blackmon, USACE Galveston District Commander, briefed on the District's major projects. Col Blackmon briefed on the many benefits of the Brazos Island Harbor Public Private Partnership and how it was helping with the work needed for that area. There were 60 Post including government/military attendees at the meeting, 1.0 PDH was available for attendees.

At the Nov 14 Post meeting Cindy Cash from AFCEC, Megan Duly from SRS/Oneida and Amy Dindal from Battelle gave a presentation on PFAS Forensics which is a new, innovative PFAS Signature Process developed by Battelle. The process uses artificial intelligence to evaluate mass spectrometry analytical data. There were 63 Post including government/military attendees at the meeting, 1.0 PDH was available for attendees.

The Feb 15, Apr 18, Jun 13, Sep 19, Oct 11, Nov 14 Post meetings and the Mar 4-5 Post Small Business Market Research Fair enabled government/military attendees up to 11 PDH credits. In addition, the Sep 19 joint Post-CMAA South Central Texas Chapter meeting covered 1 hour of Professional Ethics training, which is required for many license/certification renewals.

One government member was selected for our 2024-2025 Post Leadership Lab. A Post military member was also nominated by the Post in 2024 for the 2025-2026 SAME Leader Development Program. A Post government member was also awarded a \$500 Post Professional Development Scholarship in 2024 for continuing education.
