MCB Camp Pendleton Overview




MISSION

MCB CAMPEN operates a training base that promotes the combat readiness of the Operating Forces and the mission of other tenant commands by providing training venues, facilities, services and support in order to be responsive to the needs of Marines, Sailors and their families.

OVERVIEW

- Provides training capacity to I MEF & Tenant Commands. Schedules, controls, and provides 3-D deconfliction. Supports MEB-sized Expeditionary Ops. Live-fire and maneuver training at MEU/Battalion Level. All organic ground weapons Marine Division. Aviation ordnance up to MK82, 500 lbs. bombs.
- Training Support: 75,000 annual training events; 25,000 reservists training annually; Over 40,000 Marines annual marksmanship; Over 35,000 entry-level Marines annually
- Housing: 7,546 units; (21) Housing Areas.
- Health and Fitness: 13 Area Fitness Centers with High Intensity Tactical Training Facilities.
- Child Development and Care: Courteau CDC: Capacity, 122; Deluz CDC: Capacity, 248; Browne CDC: Capacity, 262; San Onofre CDC: Capacity, 168; Stuart Mesa CDC: Capacity, 184; Fisher Children's Center: Capacity, 80.
