To enhance the quality of life for all citizens through the balanced stewardship of America's public lands and resources.



## What is required to become a federal contractor?

- Must have an active registration in SAM.gov
  - Renew on an annual basis
  - Free to register
  - Colorado APEX Accelerator helps vendors get set up for free.
- If qualified register as a small business with the Small Business Administration!

### **Small Business**

BLM Colorado fully supports small businesses and evaluates all proposed contracts for small business participation pursuant to 48 CFR Part 19. Our goals are based on total contracting dollars spent by out offices. While the below table represents the minimums, we strive to obligate every available dollar to our "Main Street" businesses.


## Where does BLM post contract solicitations?

### What is Financial Assistance?


- Financial Assistance (31 USC 6305)
  - The principal purpose of the relationship is to transfer a thing of value to the State, local government, or other recipient
  - > BLM does not award **Grants**, but **Cooperative Agreements** 
    - ➤ **Substantial Involvement** Is the participation from agency representative to recipient throughout the Cooperative Agreement life cycle
  - > BLM does not award financial Assistance to for profit business
    - > Target organizations are local governments, non-profits, higher education



  - ➤ Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFO)
    - Posted between Nov-Jan
    - ➤ Lasts for 60 days
    - ➤ Close out Jan-Mar


## BLM Engineering Department


- Role of BLM Engineers:

- Collaborate with other agencies and engineering disciplines











## Craig Fire Operations Building

  - 14-person capacity




## Craig Fire Ops Prelim Layout



#### Air Tanker Base at GJAC

- 7 project phases (including 3 BLM-managed phases)
- BLM phase budget: \$10.5 million
- BLM Scope:
  - Demolish four existing buildings
  - Construct new 7,636 Sq. Ft. Air Tanker Base
  - Expansion of aircraft apron with 67,000 Sq. Ft. of new concrete and asphalt
