JANUARY POST MEETING

The meeting will feature **Lt Col John Marshall, USAF**, AFIMSC's Acting Division Chief, Requirements Development, Program Management, & Policy. Lt Col Marshall will provide us a **forecast of facility investment across the USAF and USSF**.

Lt Col Marshall is responsible for a \$25B annual enterprise portfolio spanning garrison and expeditionary mission support accounts including FSRM, Facility Operations, Airmen and Guardian Family Services, Security and Protection. He shapes DAF policy, funding allocations, current year distributions, and long-term strategic planning in coordination with OSW, HAF, SAF, USSF, USAF, 8 MAJCOMs, and 83 installations to ensure mission execution, and mitigate risk across all DAF power projection platforms.

Lt Col Marshall joined the Air Force in 2006 and was commissioned through the Reserve Officer Training Corp at the University of Portland, in Portland, Oregon after graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. Lt Col Marshall is a Senior Air Force Civil Engineer Officer. He has twice served as the Base Civil Engineer, commanding squadrons at Kunsan Air Base in South Korea, and Luke Air Force Base, Arizona. He has served at the Installation, Major Command, Combatant Command, and Headquarters Air Force levels. He has deployed 5 times in support of Operations ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM, NEW DAWN, RESOLUTE SUPPORT and INHERENT RESOLVE.



CREDENTIALING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CAP) FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Credentialing Assistance Program (CAP) provides financial support for professional development, education, licensure and certification preparation, exam testing, and mentoring initiatives to benefit members. SAME will reimburse a portion of exam sitting or registration fees and the costs of testing preparation and training materials upon confirmation of passing an exam.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- This program is open to all SAME members, regardless of age.
- Applicants must be a SAME member for at least 12 months before applying.
- Applicants must have passed the respective examination and provide the required documentation with the application.
- The program covers financial assistance for exam sitting fees, registration fees, and study expenses (such as books or classes for the specific exam).

APPROVED A/E/C CREDENTIALS

- Certified Construction Manager (CCM)
- Certified Energy Manager (CEM)
- Certified Facility Manager (CFM)
- Certified Professional Services Marketer (CPSM)
- Design Build Institute of America (DBIA)
- Facility Management Professional (FMP)
- Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED)
- National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technologies (NICET)
- Professional Engineer (PE)
- Project Management Professional (PMP)
- Registered Architect (RA)

PROGRAM RESTRICTIONS

No single government official or employee, or private sector individual shall receive more than \$500 in assistance through the SAME CAP program. Individuals will remain eligible to receive reimbursement through other SAME programs.

Professional Development

CREDENTIALING REVIEW COURSE (CRC) PROGRAM SHEET

OVERVIEW

The Credentialing Review Course (CRC) is a valuable benefit that provides SAME members with free access to credentialing review courses to help prepare them for professional certification exam testing.

REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must demonstrate active engagement or participation at the Post, Regional, or National level, and receive an endorsement from a Post President, Fellow, or National Board of Direction member
- Applicants must be active, paid SAME members for at least 12 months. Student memberships do not count toward this period
- The member must provide proof of registration for their respective exam within 30 days of receiving access to the review courses through PPI2Pass (for FE, PE, and ARE credentials). The exam should be scheduled within three- to nine-months of the award.
- Applicant must be willing to engage with a mentor from SAME (monthly at a minimum) throughout the time enrolled in the review course.
- Members selected for the CRC (or SAME Credentialing Assistance Program) will remain eligible to receive benefits from the other credentialing support program, no matter what order they apply to receive benefits.

ON-DEMAND CREDENTIALING REVIEW COURSES

The following professional licensure exams are available through the PPI2Pass:

- Fundamentals of Engineering Exam (All included)
- Professional Engineer Exam (All included)
- Architect Registration Examination (PcM, PM, PA, PPD, PDD, CE)

PROGRAM PARTICIPATION ACCOUNTABILITY

- Once an applicant is granted a seat in the CRC, they will have access for 12 months.
- Recipients will be assigned a mentor or they may request an established SAME member to serve as their mentor.
- Participants are to monitor overall progress based on the initial plan they establish with their mentor (and provide a schedule to the mentor to ensure the plan is being met).
- Participants will receive a warning if they fail to maintain the planned progress over the initial eight-week period.
- Should there be no improvement in the subsequent four weeks, the committee will assess the situation for additional action.

- Camp lasts one week and costs \$800.
- Camp is overnight; all food, lodging, supervision is provided.
- SAME Camps feature many dynamic activities, including building concrete beams, constructing and testing cardboard boats, and more!

(Must be at least 15 years of age to apply: rising junior, or senior.)

APPLICATION CRITERIA:

- Rising Junior or Senior in Fall 2026. At least 15 years of age at time of camp.
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- Minimum GPA of 3.2 (not required but highly recommended)
- Demonstrated leadership characteristics through participation in extracurricular activities, sports, and/or community activities.
- Physically fit.
- U.S. Citizen.
- Able to provide proof of medical insurance.

COSTS & REGISTRATION:

Registration fee for the camp is \$800. This includes lodging, meals, materials, instruction, and mentoring.

Once selected, campers must submit half the registration fee to hold their spot. Sponsorships for the other half of the amount (or more) may be available from SAME Posts.

Sponsorships are not absolutely guaranteed and if not sponsored by a Post, the camper could be responsible for all camp fees and transportation.

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College Outreach

2026 SAME Undergraduate Innovation Design Challenge

Submissions for the 2025-26 SAME Undergraduate Innovation Design Challenge are due by Feb 26, 2026. This competition, led by the SAME College Outreach COI, evaluates design projects that are being developed by college student members as part of their degree curriculums and highlights the innovative thinking of the next generation of STEM professionals.

The intent is to showcase existing work already underway to advance engineering and related subjects, and present it to SAME industry and government members. It is expected that projects submitted for consideration will be of the caliber used for college senior design or capstone projects.

Submissions in this competition will be evaluated on how well they convey the purpose of the project and its technical merit. Teams of three to five members will concisely communicate their design process and demonstrate that they have used sound analysis throughout, and do so in a way that is easily understandable to technical and non-technical audiences.

Prizes will be awarded to the winners as follows: First place team prize: \$750; Second place team prize: \$500; Third place team prize: \$250.

Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors Update (AF CE Weekly Email Jan 6)

The Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors adopted rule amendments during its November 2025 Board meeting to implement new state legislation affecting professional licensure. The changes support occupational licensing and **recognition of out-of-state licenses for military service members, military veterans, and military spouses**, along with updates to PE and RPLS renewals and the Surveying Practice Act. These rules implement legislation passed during the 89th Texas Legislature and take effect this month.
