Qualification Based Selections

Project Specific Contracts

- Used on larger projects
- Scope is limited to one project or program
- Contract Capacity can be increased
- Contract Duration can be increased

Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity

- Used on “smaller” projects
- Scope is not limited to one project or program
- Contract Capacity can not be increased
- Contract Duration is limited to the ordering period (typically 3-5 years)

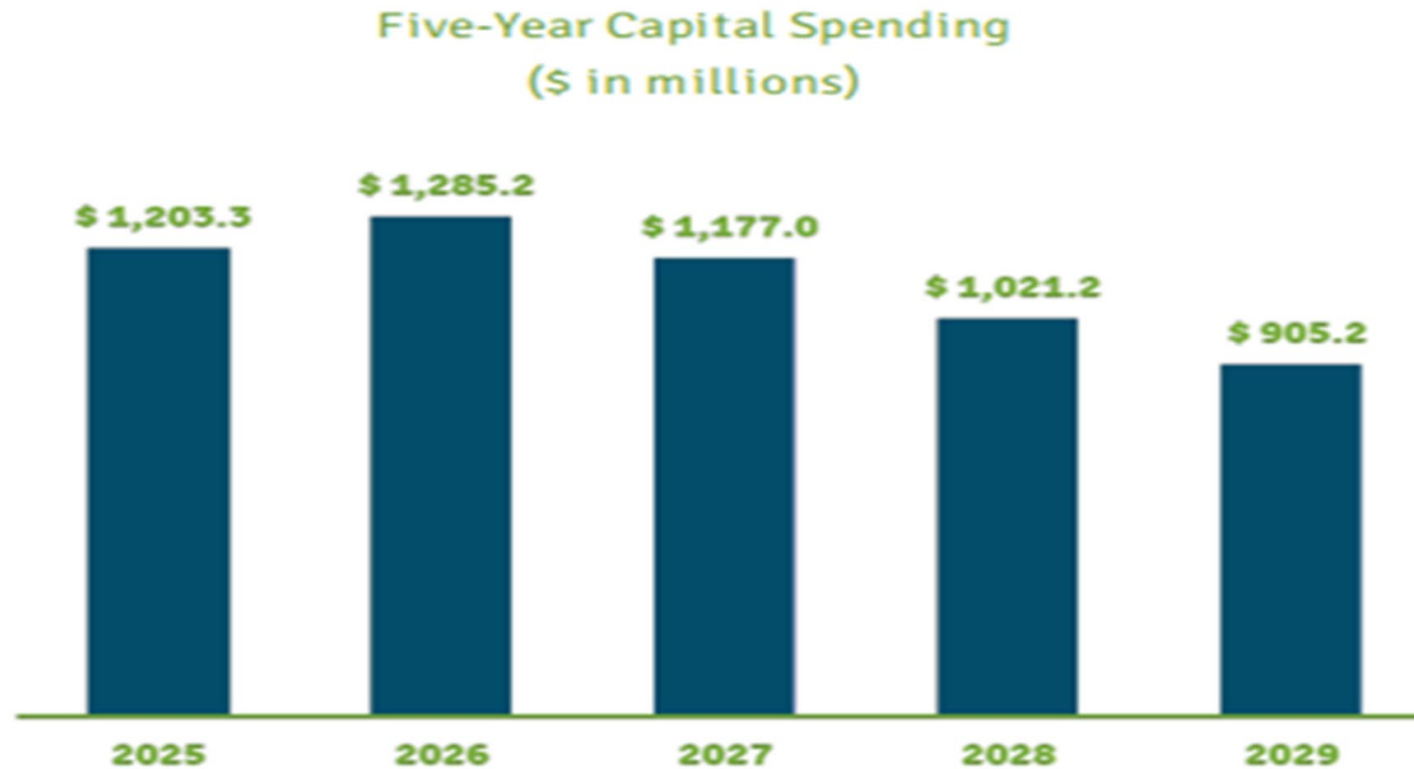

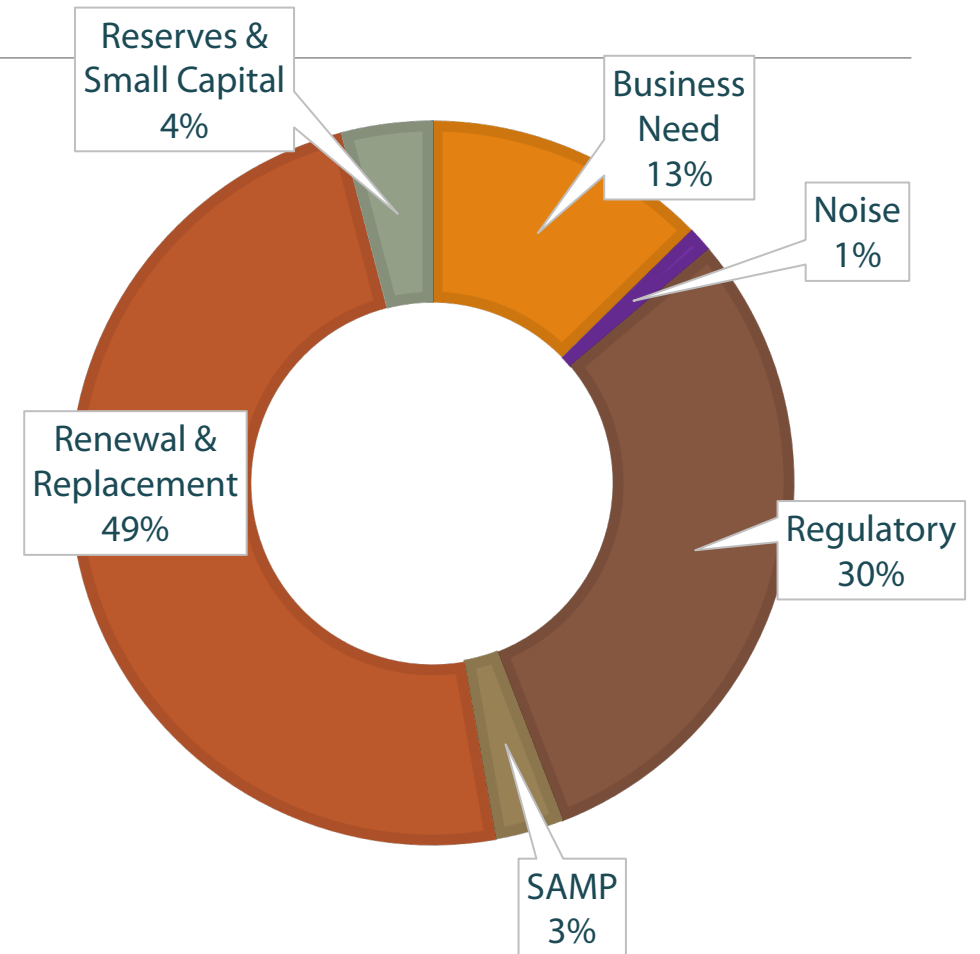
